



Frequently Asked Questions (FAQs)

When is the 24-hour pottery marathon?

Pottery24 will begin at 5pm on Friday, September 26 and end at 5pm on Saturday, September 27.

How many potters will be participating in Pottery24?

There will be 10 to 12 potters taking part in the 24-hour pottery marathon, throwing on the wheel for 2- to 4-hour shifts. Potters will be throwing on the wheel, hand-building and there will be an opportunity for the public to participate during the open house on Saturday, September 27 between 10am – 5pm.

Get your hands dirty and mess around with clay in our kid friendly zone; try your hand at clay, or jump on the potters' wheel -- adults welcome too!

Can I purchase pottery during the Pottery24 fundraising weekend?

We accept cash, cheques (made out to JustWork), VISA and Mastercard. There is no ATM at our studio, but RBC and VanCity have ATMs a block away.
